

- 3 lessons on reading comprehension
- 5 lessons on writing

ELA Expectations

Independent Daily Reading (IDR)

*Purpose: to build life-long readers and help students discuss books they are reading.

IDR Encompasses: Note taking, independent reading, and book conversations.

IDR Notes: students will have a comprehensive IDR notebook where they will be expected to read independently and record their thinking throughout the week.

Writing

*Being a Writer program: helps students develop their writing skills within a writing community. Students have the opportunity to select their topics of writing that align with our units. Students collaborate daily with a partner to help revise and edit.

***The goal is not to have a perfect piece of writing. The goal is to help them understand the writing process and show appreciation for their classmates' writing.


