End of the First Quarter-We did it!

This has been a challenging 1st quarter of school for many of our families. You worked hard and persevered! Thank you for all your support. Due to the negative impacts of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and transition to virtual learning, the Howard County Public School System has made some changes to 1st quarter grading that you may see reflected on your child's report card.

Students in primary grades will earn an I (Independent) or W (With assistance) if they have engaged in synchronous instruction. Students in intermediate grades will receive A, B or C grades if they have engaged in synchronous instruction. As a result, Canvas grades may not align with quarter 1 report card grades.

These changes are in place for 1st quarter report card grades only. Asynchronous assignments complement and support synchronous learning, please support your child with task completion and with attending support sessions as needed in the second quarter.

Spring Parent Input and BOE Town Hall

Board of Education Virtual Town Hall on Spring Semester, November 9, 2020: As part of ongoing efforts to receive stakeholder feedback and answer questions related to the 2020-2021 spring semester, the Howard County Board of Education will host a virtual town hall, Monday, November 9 from 7-9 p.m. The event will be streamed live and may be viewed on the <u>HCPSS website</u>, or on Comcast channel 95/Verizon 42 in Howard County.

The town hall will feature a panel of HCPSS leadership and Central Office staff, who will respond to pre-submitted questions. Panelists will address as many of the submitted questions as possible within the two-hour time period.

Any staff, students, parents/guardians, or community members may <u>submit questions via</u> <u>Google form</u>, which closes at 7 a.m., Monday, November 9.

Please note, there was a Board of Education meeting Thursday, November 5, during which a proposed hybrid model for the spring semester was presented. That proposal is available on the <u>BoardDocs website</u>.

The conference window opens up on Wednesday, November 11th and will be open through Thursday, November 19th. The conferences will be 20 minutes each.

Google Play Store

In an effort to continue expanding our authorized set of digital tools for virtual instruction, HCPSS has curated a new set of digital tools that are available only through Google's menu of additional services. These digital tools are approved by HCPSS and comply with federal, state and Howard County Board of Education student data privacy policies. Due to Google's settings, students must access this set of tools by utilizing Google's menu of additional services, which requires consent by a parent or guardian.

To provide consent:

- 1. Log in to HCPSS Connect.
- 2. Select More Options from the left panel.
- 3. Select HCPSS Google Menu from the middle of the page.
- 4. Click the check box to provide consent. Changes are saved automatically.

A parent or guardian must provide consent for each student by selecting the student's name at the top of the page.

The digital tools currently included are: Book Room, Word Work, Scratch BluBot, Scratch JR, Sketch-Up, Collector Classic, JamBoard, Google Earth and Minecraft: Education.

Note: Once authorized, the student will gain access within two work days.

Contactless Checkout of Media Books Continues with a twist!

At HSES we are starting week 5 of Wednesday Media Book Pickup which the rest of the HCPSS elementary schools just started last week and so now we have a small change in our program to align with the other 41 elementary schools. It was decided by HCPSS Media Services that students may request 5 books at a time. So, moving forward we will follow the same policy and reduce our total number for students in Third-Fifth Grade from 6 to 5 book Hold Requests while at the same time our Primary students in Kindergarten through Second Grade will be able to increase their requests by 1 book from 4 to 5 books. The circulation system rules have been changed so student placing holds on the PAC will only be able to have 5 holds at any one time, so, if a student has multiple Pending Holds for popular books, they will find they can only have 5 requests including them.

Please plan for the week of Thanksgiving Break as we will not be distributing books on Wednesday, November 25, 2020. All books that have not been picked up by Friday, November 20, 2020 will be checked in to allow for pending hold requests to be filled the following week on Wednesday, 12/2/2020.
