Parent/Teacher conference scheduling will open on Monday, November 8 at 8:30 a.m. HCPSS will continue to use your HCPSS Connect/Family File account to schedule Parent Teacher Conferences. Teachers will be holding virtual conferences on Monday, November 22nd, and Tuesday, November 23rd, following early dismissal for students. There may be some teachers not offering evening conferences but will be offering conferences on Wednesday, November 24th.

Beginning Monday, November 8th and continuing through Thursday, November 18th, you can log on to HCPSS Connect at www.hcpss.org/connect to access Synergy Conference Management. You can then choose your desired conference time from the teacher's availability. Please note, you are signing up with your child's homeroom teacher with a focus on Language Arts. Attendance Policy and Student Work/Teacher Expectations

We have various requests from families who are taking an emergency trip, vacation and/or other absences. While we support you in your need/ decision to take your child out of school, please know that the Attendance Policy does not require teachers to provide work/resources for unexcused/unlawful absences. More information regarding excused/ lawful and unexcused/ unlawful absences is in the policy link below. Staff are not expected to provide work ahead of time for any absence. For EXCUSED absences, we have shared highlights from the Attendance Policy below. - A student may make up work missed due to <u>lawful absence</u> and receive a recorded grade in accordance with Policies 8010 Grading and Reporting: Prekindergarten through Grade 5 and 8020 Grading and Reporting: Middle and High School.
- The school must receive notification from the parent or physician explaining the absence/tardiness of a student within five school days of the student's return or the absence/tardiness will be unlawful/unexcused.
- Teachers may assist students with make-up work when a student has an unlawful absence, however, students will not receive credit for such assignments.
- Students with unlawful absences of 10 consecutive school days or more will be withdrawn from school and may be allowed to re-enroll, provided they meet enrollment requirements, upon their return. Upon expiration of the 10-day window, the student will be withdrawn and the date of the exit will be the first day after the last day of attendance. Teachers will not be required to provide make-up work during this time of absence. For these absences to be considered as lawful, parents will need to exercise the option outlined in Section III. of these procedures.

Outdoor Lunch Preference

As we move into the colder weather, our outdoor lunch option will follow the same guidelines for implementation as we follow for recess. If you would like to change your request to move your child from eating outside to eating inside starting November 15th, please fill out this form. If we do not hear from you, we will continue have your child eat outside. https://forms.gle/jr9WS99nigfD33du8

Guidelines for Outdoor Recess/Lunch:

The following factors are considered in determining if recess is to be held outside:

- Temperature and humidity
- Wind chill
- Heat index and air quality
- Age of students
- Length of time outdoors
- Adequacy of the children's clothing
- Condition of the playground
- Falling precipitation (more than a sprinkle or mist)
- Thunder and lightning

Generally, it is assumed that students will be outside for recess/lunch when the temperature combined with the wind chill is not less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit or the heat index reading is less than 95.

Additional Half Days Added to the HCPSS Calendar

On Nov. 2nd, the Board of Education approved a modification to the academic calendar creating six 3-hour early dismissal days during the remainder of the 2021-2022 school year. Please take note of the dates below. Hollifield Station will dismiss at 12:15pm on these days:
