




- Homework Binders started last night, and will come home every night.
 Initial the calendar every night to show your child has done his/her homework.
- Monday(or first night of the week): Read and reread from the poetry binder for 10 minutes. Children can echo you, read with you, or read by themselves.
- <u>Tuesday- Thursday</u>: Read from the nightly books. These are in a plastic bag inside the HW binder. The book will be at your child's independent reading level to build confidence, fluency, and comprehension. Books may be kept for more than I night to reread them. Please listen to your child read out loud to you and talk about the book together to check for understanding.
- Math homework will begin in October. A worksheet will come home on Monday and be due back by the following Monday.

Canvas / Grading

☐ We will use the Canvas gradebook as a tool, **but not exclusively.**

What is Standards Based Instruction and Reporting?

- 1. Outlines consistent standards to be taught, is focused on learning goals, and sets purpose.
- 2. Reports student achievement *in reference to the standards they are taught* with consistent scoring practices.
- 3. Supports all students in reaching the standards.
- 4. Progress is reported compared to a standard not compared to other students.
- 5. Is equitable.

Report Card 2023

- Letter grades M, P, L for content areas (no longer I, W, N)
- Number grades 1, 2, 3 for learning behaviors
- Two pages
- Quarterly grades on first page, related arts grades and teacher comments on the second page
- Multiple measurement topics for each content area
- All students in a grade get the same report card

Building Positive Relationships




- Creating an environment where EVERY child feels good about coming to school


