HOMework

- Homework Binders started **Monday**, and will come home every night. **Initial the calendar** every night to show your child has done his/her homework.
- **Monday** (or first night of the week): Read and reread from the poetry binder for 10 minutes. Children can echo you, read with you, or read by themselves.
- **Tuesday- Thursday**: Read from the nightly books. These are in a plastic bag inside the HW binder. The book will be at your child's independent reading level to build confidence, fluency, and comprehension. Books may be kept for more than 1 night to reread them. Please listen to your child read out loud to you and talk about the book together to check for understanding.
- **Math homework will begin in October**. A worksheet will come home on Monday and be due back by the following Monday.

Canvas / Grading

- ❑ We will use the Canvas gradebook as a tool, **but not exclusively.**

- They have vomited within the last 24 hours.
- They have had diarrhea within the last 24 hours.

If your child is absent....

- Please email your child's teacher and HSESabsence@hcpss.org
- If your child is absent, they will have time to make up assignments.

Changes in Dismissal



Things you can do to make your child's teacher aware:

- Send a handwritten note the **same day**
- Call the school by 2:45 for last minute changes - we may not have time to check email

This is helpful because it eliminates any confusion of where your student is to report at the end of the school day.


