




- Homework Binders started Monday, and will come home every night.
   Initial the calendar every night to show your child has done his/her homework.
- Monday(or first night of the week): Read and reread from the poetry binder for 10 minutes. Children can echo you, read with you, or read by themselves.
- Tuesday- Thursday: Read from the nightly books. These are in a plastic bag inside the HW binder. The book will be at your child's independent reading level to build confidence, fluency, and comprehension. Books may be kept for more than I night to reread them. Please listen to your child read out loud to you and talk about the book together to check for understanding.
- Math homework will begin in October. A worksheet will come home on Monday and be due back by the following Monday.

## Canvas / Grading

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## **Building Positive Relationships**






